Justification

- This Contract will provide forensic laboratory testing and services for the DPS criminal investigations needed for prosecution.
- NMS Labs is accredited by the Texas Forensic Science Commission. In addition to holding the Commission accreditation, they are the only private laboratory to hold both the American Board of Forensic Toxicology (ABFT) and ANSI/ASQ National Accreditation Board (ANAB) in toxicology.
- For seized drugs, NMS is accredited by ANAB. They offer a catalog of over 2,500 different tests, including many not available at other laboratories. They have the most inclusive acceptance criteria in terms of testable matrices available in addition to a large scope of testable toxicological compounds and are routinely called upon for most complex and difficult analysis on the most esoteric specimens.
- NMS Labs is the only private forensic laboratory to have over 8 ABFT board-certified toxicologists.

- Sealing and repair of the storm sewer joints is used as a physical control, limiting the potential for unauthorized discharges into surface water.
- Deed Notices for instituting and maintaining storm sewer inspections, along with the physical control of chemicals through the sealing of storm sewer joints, were filed as an institutional control with the cities of Dallas and Fort Worth on June 30, 2004.
- Since instituting the storm sewer inspections and sealing of storm sewer joints in 2004, Environmental Affairs has significantly limited any unauthorized discharges into surface water.

That the Airport Board approves a request by American Airlines to exercise its option to purchase two B757 flight simulators, identified by FAA ID Numbers 2 and 4.

Description

- In the past, the Dallas Fort Worth Facility Improvement Corporation (FIC) has financed flight simulators for American Airlines (AA) using tax-exempt bonds. These bonds have been fully repaid by AA and were not obligations of the FIC or the Airport. In order to finance using tax-exempt bonds, the Airport had to technically own the equipment, which was leased back to AA, under the terms of a Master Equipment Lease.
- Pursuant to Article 12 of the Master Equipment Lease, as amended, AA has the option to purchase the equipment at Fair Market Value.
- AA has informed the Airport that two B757 Flight Simulator Training Devices identified by FAA ID Numbers 2 and 4, are now surplus equipment and AA is requesting that the Airport Board approve AA's right to exercise its option to purchase the equipment for the amount of \$3.55M (B757 #2 \$1.3M, B757 #4 \$2.25M). AA will then sell the simulators to a third party for the same amount. The proceeds from the sale will be deposited to the Joint Capital Account and used for eligible tax-exempt projects.
- An appraisal has been prepared by ICF SH&E Limited. This appraisal has determined that the simulators have liquidation values that are significantly less than the sales price listed above.

Justification

• This action provides for the disposal of surplus equipment at the AA training facility, in accordance with the terms of the Master Equipment Lease and applicable Federal Tax Laws.

Description

- On August 6, 2020 the Board approved the FY 2021 Operating and Expense Fund Budget (Resolution 2020-08-150) in the amount of \$981.4 million. This amount included \$963.4 million for Expenses and Debt Service, \$8 million Passenger Driven Contingency outside of the rate base and \$10 million for Board Contingency outside of the rate base.
- On April 1, 2021, the Board approved an amendment to the General Employee Retirement Plan providing certain enhanced benefits (Resolution 2021-04-067). 150 employees were estimated to retire at an estimated increase in the unfunded liability of \$24.7 million. Actual results are 212 employees retiring at an estimated increase of \$40.7 million versus \$24.7 million.
- Management requests the use of Board Contingency in the amount of \$10 million to make an additional pension plan contribution of \$10 million to General Employee Retirement Plan.

Justification

- The additional contribution to the General Employee Retirement Plan will increase the plan's funding ratio to equal the Department of Public Safety Retirement Plan's funding ratio. Also, it will result in future pension contributions being closer to the original estimate.

That the Chief Executive Officer or designee be authorized to re-concept Lease No. 008654 and 008653 by and between the Dallas Fort Worth International Airport Board and HG Multiplex DFW JV.

Description

- Concessionaire will re-concept Lease No. 008654, Soybu (Terminal B, Gate 28), and 008653, Travel + Leisure (Terminal B, Gate 27), into Hudson Nonstop and Decanted Wine Bar and Cafe.
- Utilizing Amazon's Just Walk Out technology, the Hudson Nonstop location offers the passenger a digital retail footprint in a contactless shopping environment. The Decanted Wine Bar/Cafe will offer various wine and food items.
- The term for both leases will increase to a new 10 year term beginning 90 days from the closure of the current locations.
- The minimum annual guarantee will be suspended for the first year of operation. Beginning in year two, the minimum annual guarantee will be equivalent to 75% of the previous year total rent. Beginning year three and thereafter, the minimum annual guarantee will increase 3% annually per section 4.02 of the Lease.
- Percent Rents will be as follows:
 - ◆ Eighteen Percent of Gross Receipts for the sale of alcoholic beverages, hereafter known as Category ALCO.
 - ◆ Fourteen Percent of Gross Receipts for the sale of food and non-alcoholic beverages hereafter known as Category 2.
 - ◆ Twelve Percent for the sale of nonprescription drugs, sundries, snacks, candy, chewing gum, mints, stationery, water, soft drinks and canned/boxed/bagged food, from the market hereafter known as Category 13.
 - ◆ Sixteen Percent for the sale of apparel, hats, souvenirs, tobacco products, film, batteries, and all other merchandise not listed in other categories, hereafter known as Category 11.
 - ◆ Ten Percent of Branding Fees, Marketing Fees, Merchandising Fees, Promotional Allowances, Retail Display Allowance (RDA), and any type of Ancillary Advertising, hereafter known as Category ALLO.
 - ◆ Ten Percent of all other Gross Receipts not listed above, hereafter known as Category MISC.

Action

That the Cities of Dallas and Fort Worth are requested to grant an easement for the DART Silver Line, and that the Chief Executive Officer or designee be authorized to sign a Compensation Agreement with DART, and to sign a joint amendment to the Operating Agreements of both DART and the Fort Worth Transportation Authority (aka Trinity Metro).

Description

- Easement. The Cities of Dallas and Fort Worth are requested to grant an easement to the Dallas Area Rapid Transit Authority (DART) for 11 parcels of land that are necessary to accommodate the DART Silver Line into the Terminal B Station at DFW Airport, as shown on the attached Exhibit A.
- Compensation Agreement. The DART Compensation Agreement will:
 - ◆ Require DART to pay the DFW Airport Board \$3,723,446 for the above mentioned easement, when it is delivered, together with temporary staging area rentals per the Schedule of Charges;
 - Require DART to make the same commitment that Trinity Metro previously made, to pay the DFW Airport Board half the cost of constructing a grade-separated crossing of the DART and Trinity Metro rail facilities at Dallas Road (less half the cost to construct a typical surface roadway), at such time that the DFW Airport Board decides to build said crossing; and
 - ◆ Require the DFW Airport Board to pay to DART an amount not to exceed \$1,677,528 to construct an at-grade crossing of the Cotton Belt railroad line to provide the DFW Department of Public Safety with quick access to all the areas of the Airport north of the Cotton Belt.
- Joint Operating Agreement Amendment. The DART Silver Line will include a spur from the Cotton Belt to the Terminal B Station, as does the existing Trinity Metro Line, as shown on the attached Exhibit B. Because the two rail lines will exist and operate within close proximity, the two transit authorities have agreed to share easement areas. The joint amendment to their respective operating agreements with the DFW Airport Board will make their operating commitments applicable to the Shared Easement Area, and because liability for environmental and other obligations may be difficult to discern, it will make them jointly and severally liable for such obligations within the Shared Easement Area.
